BC Agriculture Council Celebrates 25 Years

British Columbia Agriculture Council (BCAC) is a non-profit, non-governmental organization that provides leadership in the advocacy and proactive communication of the collective interests of all agricultural producers in British Columbia.

In 1997, the Investment Agriculture Foundation (IAF) of British Columbia allocated funding to the Central Farm Working Group to establish a new general farm organization, after the BC Federation of Agriculture had disbanded. The BC Agriculture Council emerged later that year as a result of the work undertaken. The new advocacy council was established with the stated purpose of efficiently addressing cross-commodity issues facing B.C. agriculture.

The BCAC structure was based on sector categories to facilitate effective communications and collaboration with its member organizations. The initial Board of Directors consisted of one director from each of the cattle, dairy, poultry, pork, and community agriculture sectors, and two from the horticulture sector. The Board elected Bruce Bakker, a flower grower from Langley, B.C., as its inaugural Chair.

Since its inception in 1997, BCAC has developed strong relationships with industry leaders, elected officials, policy makers, and government representatives through ongoing policy dialogues and events. BCAC staff and members are influential participants at the local, provincial, and national level where they are championing issues affecting farmers and dedicated to the advancement of B.C. agriculture.
